CSABA MOLNÁR - HUNGARY

KARMA PHUNTSHO - BHUTAN



Lopen Karma Phuntsho is a spiritual thought leader, social worker and a leading scholar on Bhutan. He teaches Buddhism and Bhutan Studies in Bhutan and abroad. He completed his full monastic training before going to Oxford to read Sanskrit and Classical Indian religions and pursue a PhD in Oriental Studies. He has worked as a researcher at Cambridge University, CNRS (Paris) and the University of Virginia. He currently works as writer on the Buddha-Nature project for Tsadra Foundation and frequently speaks Bhutan's history, religion, culture and development. Karma Phuntsho has authored six books including "The History of Bhutan", edited seven books, written over two hundred articles and essays and led over a dozen research

projects. He is also the founder of the <u>Loden Foundation</u> - a civil society organisation in Bhutan. His work has received extensive media coverage including by BBC, Forbes, BBS, Kuensel, The Bhutanese, Science, Forbes, Radio Free Asia, Oxford Today, Times of India, India Today, Tricycle and Channel News Asia.

VIKTORIA SZEMERÉDY - HUNGARY



Viktoria is a film director, writer, psychotherapist and intensive care doctor. In reverse chronological order. Built on her previous two degrees, Viktoria completed her MA in scriptwriting and directing at Staffordshire University in 2019. She started to mentor at Raindance Film School in 2020. She teaches screenplay writing and directing. At the same time, she continues to work on her films.
